## Background:

At the time of our original experimental license application was submitted, the experimental license was for a single MyRadar (MyRadar1) satellite.

Since then, we have developed 3 additional MyRadar Satellites (MyRadar2, MyRadar3, and MyRadar4) with completely identical design, construction, configuration, capabilities, and orbits. These duplicates are to provide additional opportunities to prove our satellite experiments are successful in the event our first, MyRadar1 satellite, fails to complete the mission objectives.

## Discussion:

ACME would appreciate the Commission's guidance regarding the experimental license process in how it relates to seeking approval for one satellite vs multiple satellites. The four MyRadar satellites (given above) are identical in construction and characteristics and therefore ideally request that all four satellites are covered under this application.
