Dear Linda Jacobsen,

This refers to application, File No. 0103-EX-CM-2017, for an experimental authorization.

You are advised that the Commission is unable to grant your application for the facilities requested. You are requesting to add two additional satellites to your previous license. We do not believe that a modification application is the proper vehicle for your request. Previous satellites under this license have been transferred to other entities for commercial operations. Your exhibit also indicates that this is to "collect data for customers, including the Naval Research Lab, U.S. Navy SPAWAR and the U.S. Coast Guard". Commercial operations are beyond the scope of Part 5 and should be filed with the International Bureau under Part 25. Additionally, NASA is concerned about non-federal requests in the 2200-2290 MHz and does not support your request to operate in that band. We would not be able to approve these frequencies. We encourage you to consult with the International Bureau to address your needs for commercial operations and identify appropriate spectrum to meet your needs.
