PURPOSE OF STA AND FREQUENCY COORDINATION

The purpose of this STA is to provide for the use of hand-held portable radios on two simplex UHF frequencies for operational communications for the England national football (soccer) team during matches in Miami, Florida during exhibition (friendly) games between June 3 and June 7, 2014 (inclusive). The matches will be part of England's final preparations for the 2014 FIFA World Cup where it will open against Italy on June 14 in Manaus, Brazil. The English national team will face Ecuador on Wednesday, June 4 (3 p.m., ET) and Honduras on June 7 (4:45 p.m., ET)

The details of this event when these portable radio transceivers deployed are as follows:

Sun Life Stadium, Miami, Florida: June 3-7 inclusive. The actual games are on June 4 and 7 at the stadium as indicated above.

The applicant requires at this single venue two UHF simplex channels as specified in the range 476-482 MHz for voice telephony only. The radios to be used are Motorola DP3441 DRM TDMA digital portable transceivers. The transmitter power output is 4 watts and the antenna efficiency is negative, so the ERP will be in the 3 watt range maximum. No base station facilities are sought.

A search of the Commission's Media Bureau Database by Engineer Karl Voss shows that there are no television, land mobile or other licensees authorized to use TV channel 15 within a 195 km radius of the standard coordinates for the Sun Life Stadium, Miami, Florida: (25-57-29N, 080-14-20W). The applicant will utilize only two unoccupied simplex channels inside and in the immediate vicinity of the Stadium.
