Good afternoon.

My client, BAE Systems, has submitted to the FCC two applications, with respect to its Experimental License under call sign WF2XUB.

The two pending applications are as follows:

- Pending Modification Application (File No. 0165-EX-CM-2019) (scan attached)
- Pending Renewal Application (File No. 0371-EX-CR-2019)

As you can see below, the FCC has requested that BAE Systems coordinate with DoJ with respect to the frequency 172 MHz – see message from the FCC below my signature.

In connection with this request, it is noted that the frequency 172 MHz has been authorized on the WF2XUB license since it was issued in 2006, as part of the larger band 164-173.6 MHz. As explained in the attached scan of the modification application, BAE Systems is requesting that the FCC modify the 164-173.6 MHz band to specify the specific frequencies of 164-166 MHz; 168 MHz; 170 MHz; 172 MHz; 173.6 MHz.

Accordingly, because the frequency 172 MHz has been authorized for 12 years with no incidents or complaints, and is operated at low power (.007W), BAE Systems does not anticipate any issues or concerns, but we would greatly appreciate your confirmation of coordination of the frequency for our records,.
