Here are some examples that others use to extend their service coverage.

- 1. Have churches contact their local broadcasters to see if they would be willing to carry church services as part of the station's programming.
- 2. See if the churches can provide the same service via live streaming on the internet. And, to the extent that a request is from a hospital, a lot of people driving up are likely to have smartphones and can get online content. Apparently YouTube has a capability for users to live stream that is fairly simple. Live streaming should be available to anyone with a fairly new mobile phone.
- 3. "Call-to-listen" services that do not require an internet connection. One such service (no endorsement) is Zeno Media (https://www.zenomedia.com/call-to-listen/
