

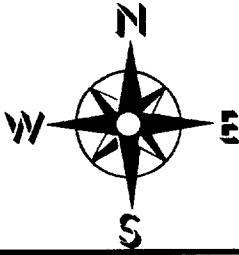

Report on Activity - Experimental Station KA2XZE

Dates: August 14 through August 18, 1997

Location: Caribou Maine (Closed Loring Air Force Base)

Purpose:

The station was set up in association with the largest special event in Maine, a concert by Dionysian Productions. This concert/event lasted three days, and brought an estimated 70,000 people into the event for this duration.

Maine State Police provided traffic reports and directions for relay to the incoming crowds, and this proved quite effective.

Programming consisted of the feature band's type of music, assembled and played by associates of that organization. Notices and information was available over the station during the entire event.

The event was calm and peaceful, and the station was considered beneficial to the concert promoters.
