

Dear Mr. Burtle:

On June 11, 2009, SkyTerra Subsidiary LLC ("SkyTerra") filed a letter requesting that the Office of Engineering and Technology establish certain conditions on the use of the 1626.5-1660 MHz frequency band by Garmin International ("Garmin"), pursuant to its above-referenced experimental authorization, in order to reduce the potential for interference to SkyTerra's licensed satellite system. Pursuant to subsequent discussions, Garmin has agreed not to transmit on the 1626.5-1660 MHz frequency band and not to apply for those frequencies in future experimental applications, and SkyTerra has agreed to withdraw its June 11, 2009 letter.
