1) Identification of the specific information for which confidential treatment is sought

We request restriction on the intended application

General Atomics' request for STA is in support of tests that will be carried out in June-November 08.

3) Explanation of the degree to which the information is commercial or financial, or contains a trade secret or is privileged

7) Identification of whether the information is available to the public and the extent of any previous disclosure of the information to third parties

This information has been presented to representatives of the US Government and a very limited number of industry individuals under Non-Disclosure Agreements (NDA).

General Atomics requests that the material should not be available for public disclosure for a period of five years. This would allow General Atomics to fully utilize its innovative concepts
