Dear Ms. Wink:

L-3 PrimeWave Communications, inc., would like to the an application with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for an experimental license to utilize pertain Requencies in the 2500-2580 MHz band in and around Pox River Valley Wisconsin, to test and demonstrate our new equipment. Wisconsin Educational Communications Board (WECB) is the Econsoe of instructional Television Pixed Service (TITES) (actities in the Fox River Valley, WHR-591. Channels A3 and A4 at Chinon, Wisconsin, and WLX-274, Channel G4 at Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. In order to test and demonstrate the L-3 equipment, WECB and L-3 have agreed to the following:

- 1. WECB consents to L-3 temporarily utilizing channels A4, G4 (the "Channels") pursuant to experimental authorization obtained by L-3 in its own name, to lest its equipment within the protected service area of the Channels, provided L-3's operations do not cause interference to any of the licensed operating systems in area, including Stations WHR-591 and WLX-274. This agreement is limited to testing rights only and does not grant any rights in the ITFS channels licensed to WECB, nor in future leasing apportunities of the ITFS channels.
- The length of this agreement shall be four (4) months starting on the day L-3 begins using said frequency after obtaining authority from the FCC. It is anticipated that L-3 will obtain the experimental authoritation in 2-4 weeks after execution of this agreement. L-3 will use the system for lest and experimentation and not for any commercial services. If WECB or any other MFS licensee experiences any interference to their educational uses, L-3 will, upon notification, immediately shull down the test until the problem can be identified and resolved.
- 3. In consideration for the use of the Channels during the term of this agreement, L-3 will provide WECB a minimum of 3 customer premise equipment sats for the duration of the test. This equipment when installed in the test sector areas will connect with
- 4. the base station. L-3 will provide any and all test data which WECB may request including but not limited to photos, progress reports, and testing/marketing results. L-3 will also provide WECB training on system theory and design, system operation.
- 5. and installation of customer premise equipment. L-3 will also provide a presentation on the test and its results to the Chillion ITFS Usor Group (CHuG) to be scheduled at a mutually beneficial time with at least two week advance motice.
- 6. L3 shall apply for and obtain the FCC experimental license thus evolding WECB incurring such licensing costs. WECB will support L3's STA application efforts by permitting L-3 to file a copy of this letter with the FCC evidencing WECB's consent.
- 7. This agreement may be terminated at any time by WECS, if L3 violates any of the terms agreed to herein, or any of the terms of its FCC authorization or any FCC rules or regulations, or if the test has not begun by September 1, 2004.
