The applicant may contact each satellite provider and obtain a written consent to their experimental operation from EchoStar, DISH Network and DirecTV via email OR the applicant may notch out the frequency band 17.2-17.4 GHz from their experimental application. Due to the airborne, high power (1 MWatt of power) radar transmitting to the surface of the earth we need some guard band to protect the satellite subscribers from potential interferences.
