I am writing on behalf of Omnipoint Data Company ("Omnipoint") to amend the above-referenced application for an experimental license in accordance with our discussions over the past two weeks. Omnipoint specifically amends its application in the following respects:

- 1. Omnipoint seeks authority to operate in the 1850-2200 MHz range.
