Dear Ms. Dortch,

I am a representative of the Adams County Communications Center, Inc. (ADCOM 911). Our project, ADCOM 911 – DIA Regional Broadband Network, will serve public safety and first responder communications needs in a 1,200 square mile area that includes Adams County and the Denver International Airport. Representatives of Oceus Networks and Space Data Corporation have contacted us to discuss their intent to seek Special Temporary Authority (STA) from the FCC to operate in the 700 MHz public safety broadband spectrum. We filed a letter raising no objections for interference to our planned public safety broadband network.

After further research, representatives of Oceus Networks and Space Data Corporation found that certain legacy narrowband 700 MHz frequencies within the 700 MHz broadband public safety band were licensed to ADCOM 911. I can confirm that these narrowband frequencies are no longer in use and ADCOM 911 raises no objection to the grant of the STA due to interference concerns with either our 700 MHz narrowband or broadband public safety operations.
