Dear Ms. Hey:

In accordance with sections 1.65 of the Commission's rules and in accordance with the practice and procedure specified by the Office of Engineering and Technology on its website, <https://fjallfoss.fcc.gov/oetcf/els/misc/FccElsFAQ.cfm>, we are writing to the Office of Engineering and Technology to request that the Commission's records be updated to properly reflect the name of the entity that holds the referenced licenses. The call sign KA2XAG, referenced above, on this letter should show Raytheon Missile Systems as the entity which holds the license.

Raytheon Missile Systems wrote to your office about this name change in January 2008, and I believe that you made the change at the time from Raytheon Company to Raytheon Missile Systems. However, after KA2XAG was renewed in April 2011, somehow the FCC changed the name back to Raytheon Company. A recent review of Raytheon Missile Systems' FCC licenses brought the issue to light, and it has prompted me to write requesting the update again.

The chart below indicates what the current entity name is and the reason for the change. By way of background, the Raytheon Spectrum Management Council has asked its business units to be responsible for the licenses that are used at their facilities. Therefore, this name change is not the result of a corporate transaction, but merely the reassignment of responsibilities within an existing corporate structure. No actual or pro forma transfers of control have taken place. In fact, as stated above, you made this correction earlier, and it appears that the Commission inadvertently changed it back.
