NARRATIVE STATEMENT

Pursuant to Section 5.3 and Section 5.61 of the FCC's rules, Airsight Inc. hereby respectfully requests a special temporary authority ("STA") from July 31st, 2026 to January 27th, 2027, to operate in the 15.7-16.55 GHz band to operate its radar.

A. Purpose of Operation and Need for Special Temporary Authority:

Echodyne has received equipment authorization from the FCC for the EchoShield radar (FCC ID 2ANLB-MESA00055). Airsight Inc. requests this STA to allow it to test the radar at a fixed rooftop location for counter-UAS detection. The STA is for testing purposes only and not for permanent installation of radars. The testing under this STA is related to radiolocation applications.

B. Location of Proposed Operation:

Airsight Inc. proposes to test the radar at a fixed location within the area described below.

C. Technical Specifications:

1. Frequencies Desired

Airsight Inc. requests authorization to operate in the 15.7-16.55 GHz band.

2. Effective Radiated Power

The EchoShield units to be deployed operate at a peak maximum transmitter power output of 180W, and a peak maximum effective radiated power of 55 kW. Operations will be conducted to comply with rules relating to human exposure to radiation.

3. Modulation and Emissions

The EchoShield radar operates using pulsed linear frequency modulation. The primary emission designator is 57M6Q3N. The emissions will not extend beyond the frequency band requested.

4. Antenna Information

No antennas will be mounted in a fashion that would require approval under FAA or FCC rules and regulations.

5. Equipment to be Used

Airsight Inc. will conduct the testing with a maximum of 1 unit.

D. Protection Against Causing Interference:

In the event that it receives a complaint of harmful interference from the proposed operation, Airsight Inc will take immediate action to address the interference. The company has designated Muhammad Taha (contact information below) to act as the “stop buzzer” for this purpose.

E. Restrictions on Operation:

Airsight Inc. recognizes that the operation of any equipment under experimental authority must not cause harmful interference to authorized facilities. Should interference occur, Airsight Inc. will take immediate steps to resolve the interference, including discontinuing operations if necessary.

In addition, Airsight Inc. will advise entities using the equipment that permission to operate has been granted under experimental authority issued to Airsight Inc., that such operation is strictly temporary, and that the equipment may not cause harmful interference.

F. Public Interest:

Grant of an authorization will permit Airsight Inc. to demonstrate its innovative radar equipment and enhance public safety.
