Pursuant to Part 5 of the Commission's rules, the Allen-Bradley Company ("Allen-Bradley") was granted an experimental authorization, Call Sign KC2XAQ, File Number 1171-EX-PL-89, effective October 23, 1989. This authorization was renewed, File Number 1171-EX-R-91, on December 1, 1991, and is scheduled to expire December 1, 1993.

By the enclosed FCC Form 405, and with the required \$35.00 filing fee and accompanying FCC Form 155, Allen-Bradley requests renewal of the 1991 grant, pursuant to Section 5.55(d) of the

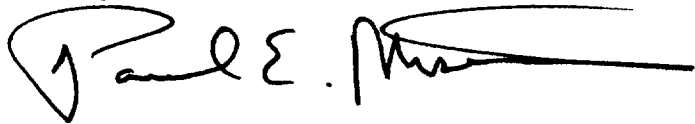
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Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 5.55(d) (1992). The scope of operations would remain unchanged from those currently authorized.

Because of personnel changes within the past two years at Allen-Bradley, the present application for renewal is made fewer than 60 days before authorization expiry.
