Mr. Trevino,

The message responds to your request for a justification to grant Aprize Satellite an experimental license longer than two years for its planned space stations. The period of research, development, and experimentation associated with the two experimental satellites Aprize intends to launch into low Earth orbit during the 4th Quarter of 2008 will continue for up to five years. This time period is consistent with the expected lifetime of the satellites, which will be placed into orbit at considerable cost.

The use of authorized experimental frequencies is essential to monitor the health status of the satellites and to collect critical data from the experimental payloads during a performance period which is longer than two years. If our request for a five-year license is denied, Aprize will accept a two-year license and will apply for a license renewal at the end of the license period.

Our satellite research activities are designed to support the US Navy, US Coast Guard and Homeland Security Agency. An allocated bandwidth of 400 KHz in the 2300 MHz to 2305 MHz frequency band would meet the requirements of this research program.
