Aprize Satellite, Inc. (“Aprize”) is applying for an experimental license for its AprizeSat-6 and AprizeSat-7 satellites. These satellites are currently licensed under File Number 0148-EX-RR-2013. As Aprize has completed experimentation and on-orbit testing of AprizeSats 6 and 7, it wishes to delete them from its experimental program and license and transfer operational responsibility for AprizeSats 6 and 7 to exactEarth, Ltd. under a new experimental license.

AprizeSats 6 and 7 carry an advanced experimental Automatic Identification System (“AIS”) payload for a ship tracking and data collection. exactEarth Ltd, a Canadian company, has purchased the AprizeSat payloads with the intention of carrying out experiments that will determine the feasibility of developing and commercializing technology that will enable low power AIS units typically found on smaller commercial tonnage and leisure vessels to be tracked from space, thereby enabling global tracking.

Upon FCC approval of a new license for AprizeSat-6 and AprizeSat-7, Aprize will initiate, and exactEarth will accept, transfer of the satellites’ experimental license through submission of FCC Form 702. exactEarth will then be authorized to conduct its experimental program.

There are no changes to AprizeSat-6 and AprizeSat-7 frequencies previously approved by the Commission. No interference issues have arisen in connection with the AprizeSat transmissions. In addition, a debris mitigation analysis was submitted to the FCC on September 9, 2010 and approved for these satellites.
