Your response indicates that you are seeking 200 devices across the U.S. "Arkenets clarifies that it seeks authority to test a maximum of 200 devices across the U.S., using up to 12 devices at each specific site." This does not seem consistent with Arkenets current licenses.

Arkenets currently has 96 devices for file 0745-EX-CN-2018 and 120 devices for 0238-EX-CN-2019. Your current application is asking for an additional 130 devices. Please explain how your current request relates to the previous licenses. Experimental licenses should not be used to deploy equipment for customers. Any non-approved devices must also be removed. Are the previous locations still operating under the previous licenses? We have concerns that the application is being used to acquire and install new customer locations rather than for experimental purposes.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of June 13, 2019 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.
