Regarding your question as to why we are applying for an experimental license over the range of 1710-2200 MHz:

The reason why we request an experimental license of this wide range of frequencies is that we want to perform tests at two frequencies separated up to 200 MHz in frequency. Since we need to find two such frequencies, separated up to 200 MHz, at which we can perform the measurements without interfering with other users, we desire to have a large flexibility in the choice of frequencies.
