It appears you received our request.

Technically, we only need one frequency for operation. I will confirm that.

I just went through the Table of Allocations and ruled out what we are not allowed to use. I have a couple of questions. Should I be looking just under the United States table column for both Government and Non-Government allocations? Are we allowed to use any of the frequencies that are listed as "BROADCASTING", "FIXED", or "AMATEUR-SATELLITE"?

Once I know which frequencies we are allowed, I will let my team know and we will figure out which frequency is best for us. Then I'll get back to you with the information.
