On behalf of BAE Systems Information and Electronic Systems Integration Inc. ("BAE Systems"), this letter is to request an additional period of time within which to respond to Ref. 12017, seeking FAA coordination for the above application.

As you are aware, the Commission recently issued a dismissal of renewal application under File No. 0237-EX-RR-2010 for failure to timely respond to Commission letter dated 8/17/2010 requesting FAA coordination (Ref. 12017). This is to confirm that BAE Systems' Phil D'Ancona (the company's Senior Counsel, whose e-mail address is specified on the inquiry) has reviewed e-mails received during the relevant time period and did not locate this e-mail from the Commission. In addition, it is unclear why the Commission's inquiry identified Ann Maria Bombardiere, who is another BAE employee.

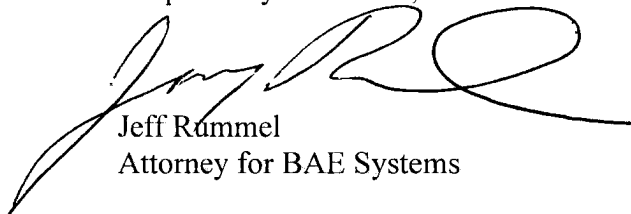

As the Commission is aware, BAE Systems is exceedingly diligent in timely responding to all Commission inquiries, and this situation appears to have prevented the company from timely responding due to factors outside the company's control.
