The requested period of operation is for 3/5/03-3/16/03. The application was filed on 3/21/03. Please explain.

The new requested frequencies cut across several services. Please explain how the requested frequency bands were selected. 29.7-29.8 MHz requires coordination in accordance with Part 90.175 of the FCC's rules. Many sub-bands of 30-50 MHz would also require the same coordination, as would 72-73, 74.6-74.8 and 75.4-76 MHz. Federal government frequencies will be coordinated with NTIA by this office. Coordination with NTIA requires a minimum of ten business days. 50-54 MHz is allocated to amateurs and is unlikely to be approved unless you can somehow get approval from ARRL. 54-72 and 76-88 MHz are TV bands and would not likely be approved. 73-74.6 MHz is allocated to radio astronomy and cannot be authorized for experimental use. 74.8-75.2 MHz is for aeronautical radionavigation and can't be approved. Please advise on how you wish to proceed.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of March 24, 2003 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.

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
