Special Conditions:

- (1) The station identification requirements of Section 5.115 of the Commission's Rules are waived.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (4) Operation is limited to activity for the purpose of testing radionavigation satellite service (RNSS) equipment and systems.

Special Conditions:

- (5) The test equipment shall only be used indoors and shall be under the control of the Blackbird Technologies.
- (6) Blackbird Technologies shall post signs on doors to the test area notifying that, "GPS re-radiator is in use and the GPS information you receive may be in error."
- (7) GPS users in the area of potential interference to GPS reception must be notified that GPS information may be impacted for periods of time.

- (9) EIRP is no greater than -140 dBm/24 MHz at 100 feet.
