Gentlemen:

This request for STA is made on behalf of our client, **Blair Communications, Inc.**, a provider of two-way private land mobile communications, for use by personnel, including security and event coordination staff, at the above-referenced golf tournament event.

Special temporary authorization is hereby requested for use of a temporary repeater and portable transceivers on four specific frequencies between 461 and 465 MHz for short distance two-way mobile voice transmission, at the Byron Nelson Golf Classic at Dallas, Texas from May 1 through May 15, 2002. The coordinates for the site are 32-52-45 N Lat., 96-57-42 W Long.

Blair Communications, Inc. currently holds a trunked, industrial/business license with the call sign WNSN446. This license has a fixed base site in Dallas, Texas at 32-46-48.5 N Lat., 96-48-14.0 W Long. The golf site, at the coordinates listed above, is only eight miles from the fixed site.

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The frequencies listed below are already licensed to Blair Communications, Inc.'s trunked license WNSN446 and the golf course is well within the interference contour of the licensed facility.

The frequencies and power levels are as follows:

Up to three hundred portable transceivers will be deployed around the event site and used by security personnel and event staff for emergency communications and coordination of the event. Blair Communications will charge a fee for providing these communications facilities.
