NAME Blue Origin Texas, LLC

This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Temporary Authority is hereby granted to operate the apparatus described below:

Purpose Of Operation:

This application is for one suborbital flight of the launch system which includes a booster and capsule.

Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) The station identification requirements of Section 5.115 of the Commission's Rules are waived.
- (3) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (4) This STA is limited to launch vehicle communications for the telemetry transmissions and reception, no earlier than 01 December, 2020, to support a single flight of the New Shepard space launch booster and capsule. This STA will expire as soon as the launch has been completed or 01 February, 2021, whichever occurs first. Applications for any future launches, or modifications to this STA, shall be submitted to the FCC for re-coordination with NTIA.
- (5) Blue Origin Texas, LLC shall be aware that future non-federal launches will be considered on a case-by-case basis, for requests in the band 2200-2290 MHz, and Blue Origin Texas, LLC shall have no expectations that future launches will be approved for operation in this band.
- (6) Experimental station shall use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links to minimize potential interference to licensed users.
- (7) All transmissions in the band 2200-2290 MHz shall comply with national and international power flux-density limits, except in cases where expected exceedances are pre-coordinated and agreed-upon by Federal Agencies.
- (8) As soon as possible, but no later than 60 business days prior to commencing flight operations, Blue Origin shall provide, as a minimum, launch date/window and planned first and second-stage trajectory, transmission frequencies with associated duration/cut-off time to: Jimmy Nguyen (jimmy.nguyen@us.af.mil), Robert Avery (robert.avery.9@us.af.mil), David Pooley (David.pooley.us.af.mil) NASA GSFC Spectrum Management Office (NASA-DL-GSFC-Spectrum-Management@nasa.gov), Richard Ontiveros (richard.ontiveros1.civ@mail.mil), Stephen Harris (stephen.b.harris6.civ@mail.mil), Carmelo Rivera (carmelo.rivera@noaa.gov), and Cathy Sham (catherine.c.sham@nasa.gov). In the event of last-minute changes, 48-hour notice is required.
- (9) Blue Origin Texas shall coordinate with the Naval Surface Warfare Center, Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD) a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to the flight test, to mitigate harmful interference to Navy/Marine Corps/DoD operations. Blue Origin Texas must also comply with any and all restrictions that may be levied by the Naval Surface Warfare Center, Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD). - (10) At least 14 days prior to operations the Stop Buzzer information, for launch operations shall be provided to NTIA (bmitchell@ntia.doc.gov) and Yuma Proving Grounds Operations, Steve Sparks (YPG Spectrum Manager) at 928-328-7144. This phone shall be manned 24/7.

Special Conditions:

- (11) Blue Origin must coordinate their S-Band operations, with the DoD-AFC (WSMR) office, at least 96 hours prior to operation, via e-mail to usarmy.wsmr.imcom-central.list.dodaafc@mail.mil. Blue Origin will provide dates/times of tests, and an electronic copy of the final FCC License, under which they will be operating.
