- (2) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (3) The Point-of-contact for Cease Buzzer: Primary (626) 302-7858 / Secondary (315) 452-8114.
- (4) These radars may not be used to prevent collisions between aircraft (manned or unmanned).
- (5) The output of these radars may not be viewed by an unmanned aircraft pilot while operating an unmanned aircraft.
- (6) The output of these radars may not be displayed in any air traffic control facility.
- (7) The output of these radars may not be used to provide target data for air traffic control use.
- (8) BNSF must coordinate their operations with the DoD Area Frequency Coordinator (DoD-AFC) - White Sands Missile Range, (WSMR), at least 96 hours in advance, via e-mail to usarmy.wsmr.imcom-central.list.dodafc@mail.mil. If operations are daily, then a weekly schedule is preferred. Please include planned dates, start and stop times, and notify DoD-AFC (WSMR) of any cancellations.
- (9) Operation is subject to coordination with the area frequency coordinator located at White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, prior to use in the state of New Mexico or other US territory within a 240-km radius of WSMR plus the area of Utah and Colorado that lies South of 41 North and between 108 and 111 West.
