 Broadcast Sports, Inc. (Odenton, MD); Experimental License KO2XDO;
 Request for Special Temporary Authority for Use Certain 2.5 GHz ITFS
 frequencies, and 494-500 MHz (Television Channel 18); PGA Championship
 (August 11-17, 2002) and NEC.**

Gentlemen:

This request for STA is made on behalf of our client, **Broadcast Sports, Inc.** ("BST"), a manufacturer and provider of video transmission equipment for remote video and film production at sporting events, and in particular, automobile racing competitions, and a video producer. Your office has granted on prior occasions special temporary authority to utilize certain frequencies at 2.3 and 2.4 GHz for video production purposes, conditioned on coordination with the Aeronautical Flight Test Telemetry Coordination Council (AFTRCC). In 2002, you granted special temporary authority for BST to utilize certain unused television channel frequencies for the PGA and NEC Golf Championship competitions.

This STA request is being made to accommodate once again the use of certain frequency bands for video production and deployment of BST RF devices during the PGA Golf Championship, this year in Rochester, New York, during the week of August 11-17, 2003, and the NEC Golf Championship in Akron, Ohio during August 18-24, 2003. The center coordinates for

the Rochester golf course are 43°-06'-49.3" N, and 077°-31'-33.2" W.. The center coordinates for the Akron golf course are 41°-0.455' N and 081°-30.467' W.

BST requests Special Temporary Authority to operate at the sites described above on the following center frequencies with an authorized power of 16 W ERP and an emission designator of 17M0FXW. These are Instructional Television Fixed Service (ITFS) frequencies: 2521 MHz, 2538 MHz, 2555 MHz, 2572 MHz and 2591 MHz. BST has contacted or will contact each ITFS license within a fifty-mile radius of the center coordinates of the golf courses, listed above, to request the use of the frequencies during the weeks specified. If BST is not able to get permission from each ITFS licensee using any of these frequencies, then BST will not use that frequency for which consent has not been granted by the licensee.

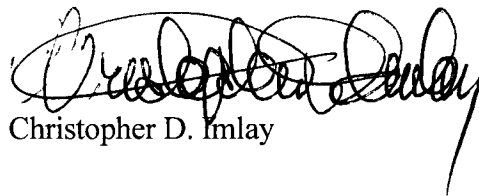
BST also requests the use of 494-500 MHz, corresponding to Television Channel 18, which is a vacant television channel in and around both Rochester, New York and Akron, Ohio according to the Commission's databases. BST, through SBE Frequency Coordinators and BST and CBS Network technical consultants, has made diligent inquiry and concluded that there are no television stations, either NTSC or DTV, or low power television stations operating on Channel 19 within a distance of 70 miles. On the 494-500 MHz frequencies, the power level of portable transceivers will be 5 watts or less ERP (using less than unity gain antennas), and the emission designator will be 16K0F3E. On the ITFS frequencies, the power level will be 16 watts ERP (1 watt TPO) and the emission designator will be 17M0FXW.

The video transmitters are TVT-50 units. The camera/transmitters will be positioned at different points on the golf courses. BST will charge fees for the video production services performed.

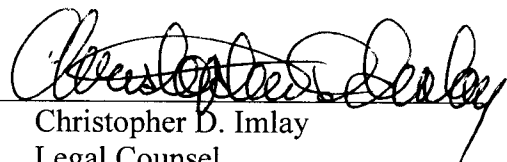
