

Frequency Coordination Exhibit
Broadcast Sports, Inc.

The applicant, Broadcast Sports, Inc., has ascertained all users in the subject ITFS band and is in the process of contacting each to obtain approval for the proposed short term operation at 2.5-2.6 GHz. Should any licensee not consent to the proposed use or if a licensee cannot be contacted, that portion of the band licensed to that licensee will not be used. Should any interference be reported to applicant, that portion of the subject band will not be used further unless and until any and all interference is resolved to the satisfaction of the complaining licensee.

With respect to the T-Band Channel (15) proposed for use for low power voice communications, the applicant will cease use of any or all of the channels without the need for Commission involvement in case of any complaint of interference to television viewers. Applicant has used this band segment in previous years at this location pursuant to STA and has not received any complaint or allegation of interference whatsoever. Applicant has coordinated all operation prior to commencement of operations with the Northern California Frequency Coordination Committee, which coordinates BAS operation in this area, and with the Society of Broadcast Engineers, Incorporated, Indianapolis, IN.

The nearest television station to the proposed operation is KUNO-DT, now operating at reduced power at Cahto Peak, CA. The proposed location is well outside the coverage area of this station, and the licensee was contacted and interposes no objection to the proposed operation.
