- (2) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (3) The designated point of contact to terminate the systems if interference occurs is Dr. Mittleman at 713-992-4137.
- (4) Operations in the 100-102 GHz and 200-205 GHz frequency bands are granted on a strict non-interference basis to the Earth Exploration-Satellite (passive), Radio Astronomy, and Space Research (passive) services. The licensee acknowledges that long term or multiple location use of passive bands is not possible, and the licensee shall transition any long-term use to a band with appropriate allocations.
