

Application Narrative

Caos Capital (“Caos”) herein requests renewal of the Conventional Experimental License for WP2XZB for an additional 24-month period to continue testing its developmental radar system in the 230.275-232.975 MHz band in Hermosa Beach, CA. The FCC initially authorized WP2XZB for a 10-month term ending on October 30, 2026. *See* ELS File No. 0778-EX-CN-2025 (“Hermosa Beach License”). {{BEGIN CONFIDENTIAL}}

The technical parameters and proposed operations for the instant application are identical to those previously authorized in the Hermosa Beach License; therefore, the information and exhibits provided in support of the Hermosa Beach License are incorporated by reference herein. Caos is concurrently coordinating this request with the MAG coordinator and will supplement the record with documentation of that concurrence once received. All coordination requirements and restrictions applicable to the Hermosa Beach License remain unchanged and will continue to apply to the extended operations.

PURPOSE OF EXPERIMENT AND AFFIRMATION OF PUBLIC INTEREST

As Congress, the Departments of Justice and Homeland Security, and the Commission have recognized, increasing unmanned aircraft systems (“UAS”) operating in or near sensitive facilities, infrastructure, and regions pose serious and growing risks to national security, public safety, and the continuity of government operations.

Caos continues to develop and refine a prototype radar system for air traffic and maritime surveillance applications. {{BEGIN CONFIDENTIAL}}
