Clarity Media Systems, LLC ("Clarity"), by its attorneys and pursuant to Special Condition No. 6 in Clarity's Experimental Radio Service License, Call Sign **WE2XNE**, File No 0692-EX-PL-2007 (issued April 24, 2008), hereby submits its Progress Report to the Federal Communications Commission relating to operations under the license. Special Condition No. 6 of Clarity's license requires Clarity to file a Progress Report six months from the date of the grant "detailing how it met its interference limitations when the system initially became operational (e.g., successful coordination with [the Society of Broadcast Engineers]), any reported interference caused by the system, and the means of remediation of such interference."

The attached Progress Report describes in detail the experimental operations that Clarity conducted in June 2008 in Winslow, Arizona and in North Salt Lake, Utah. The Report also details the efforts Clarity made to pre-coordinate its operations and test program with the Society of Broadcast Engineers and relevant Local Television Transmission Service licensees – something that was required by the Commission as separate special conditions of Clarity's Experimental Radio Service license. At no point did Clarity operate with more than ten percent of the per-channel effective radiated power ("ERP") or transmitter power output ("TPO") that was authorized in its Experimental License.

Clarity's Progress Report contains the comprehensive received signal level ("RSL") measurement results Clarity obtained at distances out to 2,400 meters (1.5 miles) from a transmitting antenna that was operated at the maximum power levels (50 mW per channel ERP



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or 5 mW per channel TPO) that will be required anywhere in the Flying J Travel Plaza system around the country. The data from these measurements, as well as data from specific measurements at or near fixed, central electronic news gathering ("ENG") sites located between 2.3 and 8.4 kilometers away from the Clarity transmitting antenna, allowed Clarity to determine with virtual certainty that the short-rangellow power multichannel television distribution system Clarity proposes for operation at Flying J Travel Plazas around the country will not cause harmful interference to ENG operations that operate or are planned for operation on a primary basis in the 2025-2110 MHz band.

In this last regard, the Progress Report describes how Clarity conducted laboratory tests using a commercially-available digital 2 GHz-band ENG receiver to confirm that the minimum desired-to-undesired ("D/U") ratio for digital ENG equipment in the 2025-2110 MHz band is 8 dB, and that a D/U ratio of 12 dB (which includes 4 dB of additional margin) would assure that a robust ENG link is maintained. In determining that Clarity's transmission system, operating at maximum required power, would not cause harmful interference, Clarity relied on its RSL measurements and the fact that it would be able effectively to ensure that a 12 dB D/U ratio is maintained at all times and at all locations near a Flying J Travel Plaza with no additional burden or onus on broadcast operations.

Clarity is very pleased with the results its comprehensive testing produced, and the fact that its repeated assertions that the proposed Clarity transmission system will not cause **harmful** interference to ENG operations have now been objectively borne out. It looks forward to using the results of its experimental operations under Experimental Radio Service License, Call Sign **WE2XNE** to help bring the ongoing Media Bureau proceeding in DA 07-1946 to a prompt and favorable conclusion.

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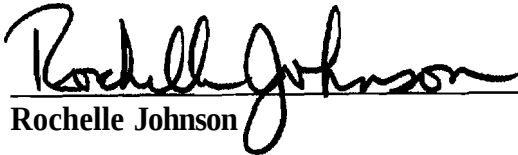
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
