Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) The station identification requirements of Section 5.115 of the Commission's Rules are waived.

Special Conditions:

- (4) GPS re-radiators are limited to a maximum EIRP value that will result in power levels not to exceed a power spectral density of -140 dBm/24 MHz measured at a distance of 100 ft from the building where the test is being conducted. Any malfunction, misalignment, or tampering of the equipment or its location which results in an increased power spectral density outside the building could cause harmful radio frequency interference to GPS receivers, including those in aircraft and/or ground based facilities.
- (5) GPS users in the area of potential interference to GPS reception must be notified that GPS information may be impacted for periods of time.
- (6) Operation is limited to activity for the purpose of testing radionavigation satellite service (RNSS) equipment and systems.

- (8) CMA Technologies shall post signs on doors to the test area notifying that, "GPS re-radiator is in use and the GPS information you receive may be in error."
