

Memorandum of Understanding
Between the Cape May County Prosecutor's Office
And
County of Cape May

Purpose: For the use of radio frequencies related to Testing and Evaluation of a P25 Trunked Radio System by the National Law Enforcement and Corrections Technology Center – Center of Excellence for Communications Technologies

1. **Parties:** The Parties to this Agreement are the Cape May County Prosecutor (Prosecutor) and the County of Cape May.
2. **Supporting Parties:** Other parties participating in the project include the National Law Enforcement and Corrections Technology Center – Center of Excellence for Communications Technologies – a program of the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs' National Institute of Justice (COE), and various vendors.
3. **Background:** Together with the COE and the Vendors, the Prosecutor's Office is conducting a Pilot Project (Project) for the testing and evaluation of a P25 Trunked Radio System provided by various Vendors. In order to conduct the Project, the Prosecutor wishes to make temporary use of all Municipal radio frequencies in the County, to be used in new software defined radios from Vendors capable of tuning VHF, UHF, 700 MHz and 800MHz (136MHz to 870MHz) in one radio. The long term results from the Project may result in a comprehensive system to provide the County with complete radio interoperability.
4. **Purpose:** The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the permissions for the Project to use a Agency's radio frequencies to communicate with that Agency's agencies for the duration of the Project.
5. **Authority:** The subject radio frequencies are to be used by the Project on a secondary basis. Normal and emergency operations will take priority over any Project testing and at the request of the Agency; the channel or frequency in question will be immediately vacated by the Project until notification is received that the subject frequencies are again available for testing.
6. **Termination:** Either party to this Agreement reserves the right to terminate their participation in the Project upon 30 days written notice.
7. **Future use:** After the project period, the frequencies will be used for interoperable communications among and between all county agencies and municipalities.

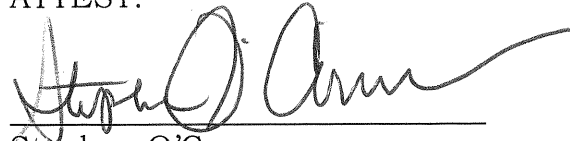
