NAME CP Communications

This Special Temporary Authorization is granted upon the express condition that it may be terminated by the Commission at any time without advance notice or hearing if in its discretion the need for such action arises. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as a finding by the Commission that the authority herein granted is or will be in the public interest beyond the express terms hereof.

This Special Temporary Authorization shall not vest in the grantee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequencies designated in the authorization beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the authorization nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This authorization is subject to the right of use of control the Government of the United States conferred by Section 706 of the Communications Act of 1934.

Special Temporary Authority is hereby granted to operate the apparatus described below:

## Special Conditions:

- (1) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (2) This frequency assignment in one of the bands 1435-1525, 2310-2320 and 2345-2390 MHz was coordinated prior to authorization with the Eastern Area Frequency Coordinator, Patrick AFB, FL, who also coordinated it, as appropriate, with Aerospace and Flight Test Radio Coordinating Council. Use of this frequency under the authority of this assignment is subject to such further coordination with the Eastern AFC, Patrick AFB, FL, as necessary to ensure compatibility with existing uses.
- (3) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (4) Operation is subject to prior coordination with the local Society of Broadcast Engineers, Inc. (SBE) frequency coordinator. Consult the list at [http://freq.sbe.org/pdf\\_files/coordinators.pdf](http://freq.sbe.org/pdf_files/coordinators.pdf) to find the appropriate coordinator.
- (5) CP Communications coordinate with the local Society of Broadcast Engineers frequency coordinator prior to operation in 494-500 MHz and 506-512 MHz bands.
- (6) CP Communications should be aware that the band 2200-2290 MHz is allocated for federal satellite and fixed line-sight operations. Non-federal use is on a case-by-case basis. CP Communications should have no expectations of automatic approval in this band in future submissions.
