It would be better to choose spot frequencies or smaller bands than requesting the whole band, 2-24 MHz. Inside the frequency band 2-24 MHz, several is use for Aeronautical Mobile (R), below are a few bands that are not allow to operate, just to name a few:

In the bands 2850-3025 kHz, 3400-3500 kHz, 4650-4700 kHz, 5450-5680 kHz, 6525-6685 kHz, 10005-10100 kHz, 11275-11400 kHz, 13260-13360 kHz, and 17900-17970 kHz, frequencies may be authorized for non-Federal flight test purposes on the condition that harmful interference will not be caused to services operating in accordance with the Table of Frequency Allocations.
