RE: EarthTraq Corporation Request for Confidential Treatment of Certain Exhibits to Application 0839-EX-CN-2026

To Whom It May Concern:

In connection with Application 0839-EX-CN-2026 (the “**Application**”), on behalf of EarthTraq Corporation, a Delaware corporation (“**EarthTraq**” or the “**Company**”), we hereby submit this request for confidential treatment for the following exhibits (the “Confidential Exhibits”) to the Application:

- EarthTraq ET02 Technical Narrative
- EarthTraq ET02 Orbital Debris Assessment Report

The Confidential Exhibits contain confidential EarthTraq trade secrets and/or commercial or financial information within the definition of 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4) (“**FOIA**”) and 47 C.F.R. § 0.457(d). Specifically, the Confidential Exhibits contain confidential trade secrets and commercial information regarding EarthTraq’s proposed satellite operations and systems, including information on the operational parameters of its in-orbit systems, trajectory and build of the ET-02 spacecraft system, as well as the confidential information regarding the shareholders of EarthTraq. Such information is not made available, routinely or otherwise, for public inspection. Accordingly, such information is exempt from disclosure and public inspection under FOIA and 47 C.F.R. § 0.457(d).

EarthTraq further submits that the Confidential Exhibits warrant confidential treatment pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 0.459. The full exhibits containing technical narrative for the ET-02 Spacecraft and ET-02 Orbital Debris Assessment Report contain trade secrets and confidential commercial information that are confidential and not made available to the public. Such information has not been disclosed previously by EarthTraq and the release of such information to the public would cause substantial competitive harm to EarthTraq. For the foregoing reasons, EarthTraq respectfully request long-term confidentiality for the listed Confidential Exhibits.

For clarity, the following nine questions posed in 47 C.F.R. § 0.459(b) are answered as follows:

(1) Identification of the specific information for which confidential treatment is sought

Answer: EarthTraq requests the following Exhibits be held confidential:

- EarthTraq ET02 Technical Narrative
- EarthTraq ET02 Orbital Debris Assessment Report

(2) Identification of the Commission proceeding in which the information was submitted or a description of the circumstances giving rise to the submission;

Answer: The Exhibits in item (1) are submitted to the Experimental License application with File Number 0839-EX-CN-2026.

(3) Explanation of the degree to which the information is commercial or financial, or contains a trade secret or is privileged;

Answer: The information contained within the Exhibits in item (1) contains information that is considered trade secret.

(4) Explanation of the degree to which the information concerns a service that is subject to competition;

Answer: As companies and government agencies aim to expand their network of remote sensors across the globe, the ability to reliably access such remote sensors increases, especially in hard-to-reach locations. Whereas others have used terrestrial networks in the past, EarthTraq has identified a novel way to reach these remote sensors that others have not been able to market as of yet. But while EarthTraq is first to market, that does not mean other competitors are not working on similar technology to access remote sensors via satellite, thus leading EarthTraq to secure their intellectual property from competitors in order to keep their market edge.

(5) Explanation of how disclosure of the information could result in substantial competitive harm;

Answer: As EarthTraq is one of the first to market for the service of satellite-based geolocation of land and sea based low power sensors, it is imperative that the information held in the Exhibits listed in (1) are held confidential to limit the ability of competitors (both current and future) from learning trade secrets into the operation and systems of the ET-02 spacecraft. EarthTraq has spent significant resources to develop these abilities on its own, and thus disclosure of such information in the Exhibits listed in (1) to competitors would reduce time to market for others than EarthTraq had to bear on its own.

(6) Identification of any measures taken by the submitting party to prevent unauthorized disclosure;

Answer: EarthTraq follows standard security protocols to ensure all data is stored on company secure systems. All material containing confidential trade secrets and commercial information is marked with “Confidential Commercial Information/Trade Secrets and FOIA Exempt”

(7) Identification of whether the information is available to the public and the extent of any previous disclosure of the information to third parties;

Answer: None of the information listed in the Exhibits listed in (1) is available to the public in any form.

(8) Justification of the period during which the submitting party asserts that material should not be available for public disclosure; and

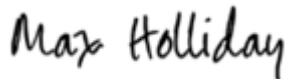
Answer: EarthTraq respectfully requests indefinite confidentiality for the Exhibits listed in (1). As discussed above, disclosure of this information, even years or decades in the future, could lead to substantial competitive harm of EarthTraq.

(9) Any other information that the party seeking confidential treatment believes may be useful in assessing whether its request for confidentiality should be granted.

Answer: EarthTraq does not currently have any other information other than the information listed in this document that may be useful in assessing whether its request for confidentiality should be granted, but reserves the right to provide more information in the future if necessary.
