Message:

1. You have requested a 12-month STA. STAs cannot be approved for periods longer than six months. If you intend to operate at these two locations for more than six months, then you need to file a request for modification to WE2XFB. You should also not count on getting a six-month STA approved and then being able to extend that authority with another STA. NTIA has let it be known to the FCC that they want longer-term experiments submitted through the normal experimental application procedure.
2. You have filed a request for expedited treatment. What experimental goal can be achieved with the two new sites that can't be achieved with the already-approved 10 sites? Two hundred sixty units over 10 sites is already a larger experiment than we usually authorize.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of July 26, 2007 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.
