Special Conditions:

- (1) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (2) Licensee should be aware that other stations may be licensed on these frequencies and if any interference occurs, the licensee of this authorization will be subject to immediate shut down.
- (3) Fenix Group, Inc. must notch out the 2025-2110 MHz frequency band
- (4) Fenix Group, Inc. must operate per conditions of FAA coordination NG T200520
- (5) Fenix Group, Inc. shall successfully secure consents from the Advanced Wireless Service licensees prior to accessing to the frequency range from 1710 MHz to 2200 MHz
- (6) Fenix Group, Inc. shall entirely notch out the 2.5 GHz band from 2500 MHz to 2690 MHz
- (7) Prior to commencing any operations in the frequencies below, the applicant must obtain consent from the following within 50 miles of the contours of the testing area:
