

Description of Proposed Experimental Operation

FTC Management Group, Inc. ("FTC") hereby files this Experimental Application ("Application") to allow it to utilize the Lower 700 MHz Band B Block license in CMA630 (South Carolina-6 Clarendon)("License") as part of a one-week Long Term Evolution ("LTE") wireless deployment trial.

FTC is the licensee (WPWV301) of the Lower 700 MHz band C Block license in CMA630. Use of the B Block license, which is currently held by the FCC and pending re-auction by the Federal Communications Commission on July 19, 2011, is critical to the wireless deployment testing to help rural and independent companies in South Carolina make a determination on the feasibility and need for the deployment of next-generation wireless services in rural areas. The License will be used in conjunction with FTC's C Block license between March 14 and March 18, 2011 for the deployment of a 10 MHz LTE carrier centered in the middle of both the Lower 700 MHz Band C and B block licenses. The experimental operation of the License will cease by midnight March 18, 2011.

Grant of this experimental authorization is in the public interest as it will allow Alcatel-Lucent, who will be assisting in conducting the trial, to demonstrate to rural wireless providers the benefits of LTE technology. This technology, if deployed in rural parts of South Carolina, will provide high-speed data to areas to rural underserved and unserved areas. Because this license is currently still held by the FCC, grant of this experimental license will not harm existing carriers or operators.
