Special Conditions:

- (2) Following launch of the satellite, the licensee must notify the FCC through electronic submission to the license file, of the status of the satellite (transmissions commenced, etc.), not later than 7 days after commencement or expected commencement of transmissions, and of termination of transmissions, not later than three months after such termination.
- (3) Upon receipt of a conjunction warning from the JSpOC or other source, the licensee must review the warning and take all possible steps to assess and, if necessary, to mitigate collision risk, including, but not limited to: contacting the operator of any active spacecraft involved in such warning; sharing ephemeris data and other appropriate operational information with any such operator; modifying spacecraft attitude and/or operations.
- (4) The licensee shall provide the Commission with all information required for the Advance Publication, Coordination and Notification of frequency assignments pursuant to the International Radio Regulations. This includes the preparation of draft materials, to be provided to the Commission prior to submission to the International Telecommunication Union. The authorized operations require notification of frequency assignments pursuant to Article 11 of the ITU Radio Regulations. Licensee shall provide the FCC, not later than 30 days after a frequency assignment is brought into use, the documents required for notification (including SpaceCap Notification MDB file) of such frequency assignments. The licensee shall also prepare materials for informing the ITU that a frequency assignments has been brought into use, or that its use has been suspended or permanently discontinued.
- (5) The license is conditioned on deployment of the drag enhancement device prior to the end of the license term. Section 1.62 of the FCC rules (Operation pending action on renewal application) is not applicable to this license, and the activities authorized by this license are not considered to be of a continuing nature after October 6, 2028. The licensee may continue operations after the license term only by filing a request, not later than ninety days prior to the end of the license term, and obtaining a grant of that request. The request should include information concerning the reliability of post-mission disposal for any extended period of operations requested.

Licensee is required to submit an update regarding the deployment of the drag enhancement device no later than three months after the mission end date. This information should confirm whether the spacecraft has successfully deployed the drag enhancement device or not. If unsuccessful, Licensee must provide additional information to the record detailing all known and suspected issues.
