DESCRIPTION OF EXPERIMENT**

EXPEDITED PROCESSING REQUESTED.

Harris Corporation (“Harris”) hereby requests that the above-captioned application be processed on an expedited basis because the proposed equipment is intended for testing and eventual deployment to the United States military. The experimental equipment incorporates significant improvements over the communications equipment currently deployed to troops.

Expedited processing of the Harris application is therefore a matter of serious national security and will advance the declared war on terror. Failure to process the application on an expedited basis would disserve the public interest by delaying the testing and deployment of powerful new communications equipment to the United States military. For all of these reasons, Harris respectfully requests expedited processing of the application, and a decision concerning the application on or before **December 1, 2007**.

Consolidated Response to Questions 4 and 5.

Harris is requesting Special Temporary Authority (“STA”) to conduct experimental testing utilizing the commercially-available equipment identified herein, in order to develop a new family of radio communications equipment for use by military, government, and public safety organizations, based on the emerging Wireless Metropolitan Area Network (MAN) technology that is standardized in the IEEE 802.16-2004 and 802.16e-2005 standards, with implementations certified by the WiMAX forum.

Harris customers in these organizations, particularly in the United States military, have expressed dire needs for communication systems that exhibit high performance at a price significantly lower than that which is provided by technologies currently available for use in these environments.

Harris proposes to use the commercially-available equipment identified herein, which has features similar to the intended product, and to perform tests to evaluate its performance characteristics. The purpose of the test program is to aid in the establishment of product requirements and features to be incorporated into the planned product offering. Currently-available products are designed to operate in domestic or international licensed bands. Although the identified equipment closely matches anticipated product characteristics, a design modification will be required in a future final product design phase to change the operating frequency band. Therefore, this STA application will not lead to an application for permanent operation in the identified band.

As shown in the attached document, a review of the Commission’s database indicates that there are no licensed operations in the proposed operating bands (3400-3600 MHz, 4400-5000 MHz, and 5700-5800 MHz) within a 60 kilometer radius of the proposed operations. However, based on the proposed nature of the testing, Harris believes that any potential for interference

will be minimal. Harris nonetheless acknowledges that its operations will be on a non-interference basis.

Because the equipment is technically incapable of providing station identification, Harris respectfully requests a waiver of the station identification provisions of Section 5.115 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 5.115.

All network traffic will be simulated traffic only, solely for evaluation purposes and not for the purpose of providing network data communications services to user stations.

Harris submits that a grant of an experimental STA is necessary and in the public interest because it will advance the national security efforts identified above.

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
