Emissions are discussed in Part 2.201 of the FCC's rules. As 2.201(g) states, the emission designator is composed of the three-character emission symbol which is preceded by the four-character bandwidth symbol described in 2.202(b)(1). I am guessing from your emails that the designator should be 20K0G1D. You would enter your bandwidth as "20" and choose "kHz" as the bandwidth units, if the bandwidth is indeed 20 kHz. You would then enter "G1D" in the three emission blanks. "G1D" represents phase modulation of a single channel containing quantized or digital information, without the use of a modulating sub-carrier, excluding time-division multiplexing, and the information being transmitted is data, telemetry or telecommand. If this is correct, return to our filing site and amend your application accordingly.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of March 06, 2006 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.
