- (3) In lieu of frequency tolerance, the occupied bandwidth of the emission shall not extend beyond the band limits set forth above.
- (4) Licensee must avoid pointing the main beam transmitting antenna within 10 degrees of any point on the geostationary orbit arc in the 37.5-40 GHz band.
