FCC Form 442 Supplementary Commitment to Coordinate with Public Safety Entities

iRobot is requesting a 60-month Experimental License because many of its public safety and US government agency contracts require the ongoing development, manufacturing, testing, and delivery of iRobots either for an indefinite period or for a period greater than 24-months. In order to alleviate the burdens associated with applying for a new license in 24-months, iRobot is applying for a 60-month license.

iRobot recognizes that the 4.9 GHz frequency band is allocated for public safety purposes. Consequently, before iRobot begins operations, iRobot will check the Universal Licensing System (PA Radio Service) to determine whether there are any public safety entities operating in the 4.9 GHz frequency band at the locations requested in its Form 442 application. If there are public safety entities operating in the band at the locations, iRobot will coordinate with the public safety entities to prevent interference with public safety operations.
