

RESPONSE TO QUESTION 14

Inmarsat, Inc. (“Inmarsat”) submits this response to Question 14 of FCC Form 442 out of an abundance of caution. The Commission recently dismissed a Petition for Declaratory Ruling (the “Petition”) filed by the Inmarsat’s affiliate, Inmarsat Global Limited (“Inmarsat Global”). Inmarsat Global had sought United States market access to provide MSS in the 2 GHz Band. Subsequent to Inmarsat Global’s filing, the Commission assigned all 2 GHz spectrum currently allocated for MSS in the United States to two other satellite operators, and thus dismissed Inmarsat Global’s Petition.¹ Inmarsat Global has sought reconsideration of both the Commission’s disposition of the 2 GHz Band and the accompanying dismissal of its Petition.²
