

EXHIBIT TO LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION

This is a follow-on application to obtain renewal of an experimental special temporary authorization, OET File No. 0006-EX-AL-2016 (Call Sign WJ9XDY).

On April 4, 2016, iRobot Defense Holdings, Inc. ("Applicant"), a Delaware corporation and wholly-owned subsidiary of Endeavor Robotic Holdings, Inc. ("Endeavor"), a Delaware corporation and wholly-owned subsidiary of Arlington Capital Partners III, L.P. ("Arlington Capital"), acquired assets that are used in the operation of the Defense and Security business unit (the "Business") of iRobot Corporation ("Assignor") and assumed certain specified liabilities of Assignor arising from or otherwise related to the Business. The transaction occurred through the acquisition of substantially all of the assets of Assignor solely or primarily related to the Business. At the close of the transaction, the Business, including all applicable permits, licenses, and authorizations required to operate the Business, became the property of and held by Applicant. The ultimate parent company of Applicant, Arlington Capital, indirectly owns 100% of the interest in Applicant. Its business address is:

Applicant obtained the Commission's consent to the assignment from Assignor to Applicant of an experimental special temporary authorization, OET File No. 1174-EX-ST-2015, which was assigned to Applicant in the assignment application referenced at the beginning of this attachment, on February 23, 2016. This experimental special temporary authorization is set to expire on May 1, 2016.

The renewal of the authorization will strengthen Applicant's commitment to and enhance efficiencies for developing new technologies to support mission-critical industries. The products and services directly supported by the authorization serve several strategic public and private sector industries, including defense and homeland security. Given its recent acquisition of the authorization and its inability fully to assess and develop the authorization in accordance with these goals in that period, Applicant requests this renewal for 180 days.

For the foregoing reasons, Applicant respectfully requests that the Commission grant the renewal application.
