Re: Amendment of Experimental Application dated 25 September 1991
and Expedited Consideration Request.

Dear Ms. Searcy:

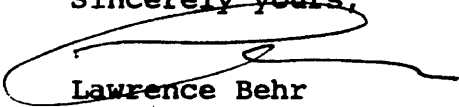
On 25 September 1991, an application for experimental authority was tendered, seeking to conduct experiments on a new class of Traveler's Information Service (TIS) antennas. The application discussed the TIS justification in terms of the then authorized frequencies 530 kHz and 1610 kHz. However, in MM Docket #87-267, the Commission's Report and Order expanded available frequencies to any channel in the 530 - 1700 kHz range, effective at a date near 1 January 1992.

As a consequence, there is now an urgency in granting this experimental authorization so that new antennas may be quickly available for the newly authorized frequencies. Thus, expedited consideration is requested.

Additionally, the experimental application specifies a test frequency in the AM band at 1040 kHz to supplement on 530 and 1610 kHz. In order to make adequate measurements of antenna performance in the larger, new TIS band, addition frequencies of 790 and 1290 kHz are requested. As reported for the other frequencies meet all TIS interference requirements to other AM stations, and will not cause interference to any existing station. The same operating parameters are requested for those added frequencies as one requested for 1040 kHz.
