Mr. Hibbeler,

An agency requires further information to determine how use of the requested band of 1710 - 1950 MHz, with the 200 kHz requested bandwidth supports WiMAX data throughput. According to the WiMAX forum, the desired worldwide bands being coordinated are not those requested, shown below in an excerpt from the WiMAX site at <http://www.wimaxforum.org/home/> and nominally require a minimum 3.5 MHz of bandwidth to achieve WiMAX capabilities.

The attached US Army letter indicates that the duration of operation would be from 2nd to 27th of June but you have filed for 5 or 6 months grant. The requested frequency band 1710-1755 MHz is a restricted federal band and authorization within this band is strictly prohibited for any testing or development in the US.

The items indicated above must be submitted before processing can continue on the above referenced application. Failure to provide the requested information within 30 days of May 09, 2008 may result in application dismissal pursuant to Section 5.67 and forfeiture of the filing fee pursuant to Section 1.1108.

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
