>>I need info on the following:

>>1. You requested some frequencies in the 1710 - 1850 MHz band. This band is >>allocated for >>strictly government use in the United States. Is the product you are >>developing for use outside >>the United States? If not, explain why you need this band.

Yes, that is correct. Our product is for use outside of the United States. We're developing a product to operate in the 1710-1850 MHz band, which is allocated for mobile communications in several countries outside of the United States.

>>2. You listed two transmitter locations, one as fixed/base and the other as >>mobile. The >>fixed/base location lists only mobile frequencies and the radius of operation >>is different for the >>two transmitter locations. Could you please explain these two anomalies?

Both of these anomalies have been fixed and the application resubmitted. The frequencies for the fixed/base are now Fixed and the radius of operation is exactly the same as for both transmitter locations.

>>3. You didn't give any emission or bandwidth data. Please furnish these data. >>Emission and >>bandwidth are described in Parts 2.201 and 2.202 of the FCC's Rules, which >>can be downloaded >>from >>http://www.fcc.gov/Bureaus/Engineering_Technology/Documents/cfr/1998/47cfr2.pdf>>f.
