

Request that materials and information submitted to the FCC be withheld from public inspection.

Regarding 47 CFR 0.459 guidelines – reasons for withholding from inspection:

1. Confidentiality is being sought for the following exhibits in STA Application 0791-EX-ST-2006 labeled: "Antenna Range"; "Justification for Expedited Handling"; "Sensitive Information"; "Additional Information", and "Equipment List".
2. The Commission proceeding is the consideration of the application for an STA as stated above.
3. The information is highly sensitive to disclosure because it relates to military operations.
4. The information does not relate to commercial competition.
5. The information has little, if any, bearing on commercial competitive harm.
6. Lockheed Martin follows normal industrial security procedures to protect those aspects of the information which have a federal security designation. Furthermore, Lockheed Martin employees do not discuss program aspects with outside parties, do not make mention of any things of substance in e-mails, and carefully protect those things that are deemed sensitive although unclassified.
7. The information is not available to the general public. No prior disclosures have been made to third parties in the civilian world.
8. As long as the devices to be tested are effective, this material should not be made public. The period could extend to as much as ten (10) years.
9. Although all statements made in the exhibits to the application for an STA are unclassified, some of the statements are sensitive information that should be protected.
